

We will reopen our modified allergy injection service beginning on Monday, June 1. Procedural changes have been made as a result of the Covid-19 pandemic. The following changes are in effect immediately and are non-negotiable.

We are no longer able to offer walk-in injection service. All injections must be scheduled in advance. You may schedule one date at a time. Same day bookings will not be permitted. You should call the office at 231-487-6575 and speak to Teresa or Angie to schedule your first injection. We will ask you to confirm your mobile phone number and place a credit card number on file to charge any copays, coinsurance or deductible amounts due for injection services. Subsequent injections will be scheduled by the injection nurse at check out.

On the date of your scheduled injection, we ask that you call the front desk to inform us that you have arrived in the parking lot. You must arrive on time for your scheduled appointment or you will forfeit your appointment and be asked to reschedule for a different day. Remain in your car until you have been notified by text to enter the office. The receptionist will notify the injection nurse you have arrived and will apply any applicable charges to your credit card on file. She will provide a receipt to you while you are in the office. The nurse will send a text message to your mobile number on file when it is time for you to enter the office to receive your injection. You must wear a face covering to enter the office and you must have your EpiPen auto injector with you. You will be denied access if you do not comply. Minor patients may be accompanied by one adult and adult patients must enter the office alone. We must continue to observe the six foot social distancing guidelines which will limit space available in the waiting room. Once you have entered the office, please take a seat in the waiting room and the injection nurse will escort you to the injection room to administer the injection. You must remain in the waiting room for the usual 30 minutes following your injection. The nurse will return when your waiting period has concluded to check your reaction. At the conclusion of the appointment, she will schedule your next injection appointment.

We are unable to permit early or late arrivals as we must maintain social distancing guidelines in the waiting room. Covid-19 screening questions and temperature checks will continue to be mandatory as well.

Our patient population includes those with immune system deficiencies and those who are at increased risk for complications due to exposure to the Covid-19 virus. We must all work together to minimize exposure risk to this vulnerable population and to mitigate community spread. Your cooperation is required to continue this service in a safe and efficient manner.
